Walking together in good times and bad, writes Pat Gulik, we live out our faith

It is with a mixture of excitement, sadness and relief that I write my last Grace Notes article. I am retiring, and my last day at Grace will be Wednesday, May 18.

Sadness, because I will miss the people that I have come to know and care deeply about over the past three years. It has been my great pleasure and honor to share good times with yo — trips, programs and groups to promote community, and to be part of the difficult times — to provide information and support, to advocate for you and to be a caring presence. Members of this congregation truly live out their faith, both by caring for each other and in service to the larger community. Grace members have provided professional services, such as counseling and dental care, at no charge, when a request was made.

Working with the staff, Health Cabinet and congregation members to navigate the past two years during the coronavirus pandemic was a particular joy and challenge. The Grace community really pulled together during this time. Grace members made and donated masks to low-income communities early in the pandemic. They also made regular phone calls and did shopping for isolated and high-risk members. Staff and members of the Health Cabinet came together to enable our seniors, high-risk members and our school staff to get vaccinated in February and March of 2021, when it was so difficult to obtain the vaccine. (A special thanks to the pharmacists at Osco, who supplied and administered vaccines at six clinics at Grace.)

Excitement, because retirement will give me more time to visit with my children and grandchildren. Also, my husband and I



love to travel and look forward to doing that, now that the craziness of the past two years seems to be winding down. I also look forward to trying something new — just not sure what that is yet.

And relief. Because, although there are many things that I love about this job — being invited into your lives and walking with you during difficult times, sharing information via the monthly "Notes from the Parish Nurse" emails, worshipping with you in church and sharing communion with you at home, and simply walking with you on this journey of life — writing articles (like this one for Grace Notes) is particularly difficult and stressful for me. And this is the last one!
