We welcome you in the name of Jesus Christ as we gather to hear God's holy Word and celebrate the meal of Holy Communion. We are blessed by your presence, just as you are. As God welcomes all people through the saving grace of Jesus, so do we seek to welcome God's people of all races, social statuses, physical and mental abilities, sexual orientations, and gender identities to be together in Christ – to love, to grow, and to serve. Should you have no church home, you are invited to consider Grace. We encourage you to fill out the perforated page on the back of the bulletin and place it in the offering plate. Welcome!

Children's resources, including activity bags, worship bulletins and booster seats, are available in the narthex and from the ushers.

Nursery care is provided at both the 8:30 and 11:00 worship services for children ages 4 and under. The nursery is located across from Fellowship Hall. From the atrium, go through the Lamb Door by the elevator, up half a flight of stairs and turn right. From the sanctuary, go through the door by the stone baptismal font, up the stairs and turn left. A silent paging system allows the nursery staff to contact parents when needed.

Assistance in Worship: For those who find it difficult to stand during any part of the service, please remain seated and contact an usher if you would like Holy Communion to be brought to you. Sound enhancement units are available in the back of the church. Large print bulletins are available from the ushers in the back of the church and at the Division Street door.

In Holy Communion the crucified and risen Christ is present, giving his true body and blood as food and drink. All baptized Christians are invited to the table where Christ himself is host. If you desire to be baptized, or to learn more about Holy Baptism, please speak to one of the pastors.

Grace Council Statement on Racism: Racism, manifested in individual acts and present throughout systems, continues to prevent us from being the beloved community that God intends. Our faith in the crucified and risen Christ compels us to speak. We speak against the sin of racism. We speak in solidarity with Black people and all people of color, each of whom is precious to God. We stand with and for Black people within our church and school and in the larger community.

We commit ourselves to following Jesus Christ into the world in the hope that, by the Spirit's power, God's Kingdom would come on earth as it is in heaven. We look with hope and anticipation to a season of growth and change as Grace becomes a more faithful witness to God's wide welcome in Christ. We see this as the beginning, not the end, of the conversation. We pray for the Holy Spirit to guide us, and for the courage to follow.

As We Gather

The Holy Spirit did not wait for them to be ready. The Father and the Son didn't send the Spirit to a people who were already bold, courageous, and faithful. The Spirit was poured out on the fiftieth day to the disciples who were still huddled in hiding. The Spirit-filled disciples go forth into a world even less ready to receive the gospel. Neither the disciples nor the crowds were ready. The Spirit came anyway. Today, we live in a world still marked by sin, marred by death. We are not always bold, courageous, or faithful. Still we cry out, "Come, Holy Spirit!" And still the Spirit comes. Send us we pray, Holy Spirit, into this world, to proclaim the gospel of Jesus Christ to all flesh, all people, in all places.





FIRST READING: Acts 2:1–21

When the day of Pentecost had come, [the apostles] were all together in one place. ²And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. ⁴All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Philip said to [Jesus], "Lord, show us the Father, and we will be satisfied." ⁹Jesus said to him, "Have I been with you all this time, Philip, and you still do not know me? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'? ¹⁰Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own; but the Father who dwells in me does his works. ¹¹Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; but if you do not, then believe me because of the works themselves. ¹²Very truly, I tell you, the one who believes in me will also do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to the Father. ¹³I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. ¹⁴If in my name you ask me for anything, I will do it.

¹⁵If you love me, you will keep my commandments. ¹⁶And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate, to be with you forever. ¹⁷This is the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, because he abides with you, and he will be in you.

²⁵I have said these things to you while I am still with you. ²⁶But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I have said to you. ²⁷Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid."






GREAT THANKSGIVING


For as often as we eat of this bread and drink from this cup we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

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COME, HOLY SPIRIT - RENEW THE WHOLE CREATION

"Come, Holy Spirit - renew the whole creation" is a cry of human helplessness, faithlessness, powerlessness. When our world hungers for justice and peace, when our imaginations run sterile, when our will loses its energy, then we cry, "Come, Holy Spirit, rescue us from coolness, cynicism, and selfishness." When problems become intractable, human love grows cold, and solidarity collapses, we often look for solutions to various fanaticisms, social, political, religious. We would do better to be called back to our sacred duty of interceding for the world, even as the Spirit intercedes for us (Rom.8:27).

In the creation stories of Genesis two expressions bring out the relation between human beings and the rest of creation: in the first chapter we read about being created in the image of God, in chapter two we are being inbreathed with the breath of God. In the second chapter God also puts Adam in the garden to till and "keep" it, expressing our responsibility for the care and protection of creation. God's story is about the good creation, the damage done to it, and its need of mending. When Jesus chose to make the kingdom of God the central theme of his ministry, he affirms in words and deeds that the goal of his work is the renewal of God's creation.

Part of the Scripture readings for Pentecost is Psalm 104:30, "When you send forth your Spirit, they are created; and you renew the face of the earth." The whole psalm speaks about God's Spirit creating and renewing the earth, not just human beings. It reminds us of our continuity with creation, like the Leviathan sporting in the sea. The beauty of all creation helps us to appreciate the very sanctity of nature.

The same Spirit of God is also behind artistic creativity as when God instructs Moses through Rezalel how to make the furnishings of the Ark (Ex. 31:2). This is also reflected in human creativity. The Swedish writer Karin Boye once wrote: "I would like to carve a wooden spoon so plain that people see God." The French artist Georges Rouault expressed a similar desire to create a work of art that anyone seeing it would become a believer.

"Come, Holy Spirit - renew the whole creation." How do we make this prayer operative in the local congregation? The key lies in an organic vision of worship when the baptized are regularly gathered by the Holy Spirit in community in order to be nurtured by God's Word and the Holy Supper. They are then sent out by the same Spirit to mend creation where it is broken. In other words, to be a faithful believer is not simply to go to church, but to be the church wherever one goes.
