COMMUNION

DONALD JAMES HEIMBURGER

Donald James Heimburger, born on April 24, 1947, in Urbana, Illinois, was welcomed peacefully into heaven on June 10, 2022, surrounded by his wife and two daughters. He was the son of Agnes (Ruhnow) and Raymond Heimburger.

Don always wanted to be a journalist and also be connected to railroads and model railroading. He was able to do all three during his lifetime. His interest in publications began when as a young boy he made short "magazines" weekly to give to his parents. His first job as a paper carrier further fueled his interest, and at the age of 15 he started his own publication—a model railroad periodical called the S Gaugian. He continued to hone his skills through a job as a newspaper reporter for the News-Gazette while earning his Journalism degree from the University of Illinois at Champaign-Urbana in 1969. After graduation, his job for seven years as Press Representative at the Illinois Central Railroad was put on hold when he was drafted for the U.S. Army in 1970. There he served as editor of the newspaper at Ft. Knox, Kentucky, for two years. In 1979, Don purchased his hometown newspaper in Tolono, Illinois, all the while continuing to nurture his initial publication, the S Gaugian. Eventually it grew so much he decided to start his own publishing company called Heimburger House Publishing Company as well as a model railroad product company called Scenery Unlimited, both of which he ran with his faithful wife, Marilyn, until retirement in 2019. He published more than 50 different model and prototype railroad books, a second magazine called Sn3 Modeler, and worked with 75 major book publishing companies that published prototype railroad and kids' railroad books, which his company sold to individuals, major hobby stores, and railroad museums in the US and foreign countries. Don himself authored more than 14 books.

Don met Marilyn at the University of Illinois when he carried her cake pans across the quad after a potluck at the University Lutheran Student Center.

Always seeking new and exciting adventures, later in life Don created the EuropeanTraveler.net website, where he and Marilyn posted intriguing travel stories and photographs documenting their many trips abroad. They also wrote feature articles for German Life magazine.

Don and Marilyn were faithful attendees at Grace Lutheran Church, where Don served for many years as head usher, using his leadership skills and humor to help everyone feel welcome. He loved being co-chair of Grace's annual Oktoberfest celebration. With six grandkids, Don had plenty of opportunities to share his love of playing with trains and to be a fun and loving grandpa.

Don is survived by his loving wife of 49 years, Marilyn, children Amy (Kyle) Luetgert and Alison (Steve) Ramsey, and grandchildren Kaitlyn (18), Kellen (16), Everitt (12), Laina (11), Maddock (9), and Deacon (7), brother John (Christine), sisters Louise (Gary) Bell and Ruth (Bob) Pietrzyk.
