# Welcome Kits

Grace's Social Ministry Committee is organizing 30 Welcome Kits for Lutheran Social Services of Illinois (LSSI). The kits will be distributed to 5- to 10-year-old foster care children served by LSSI. So often, children arrive at foster care homes feeling anxious and alone with only a black plastic bag containing their possessions. Packed in duffle bags, the Welcome Kits contain comfort items, such as a fleece blankets, and stuffed animals, and hygiene items, including shampoo and toothpaste.

We have been working on making tie fleece blankets for the kits and already have some of the items needed including books, stuffed animals and toothbrushes. We are asking the congregation to sign up to purchase the additional items on the list and drop them off at Grace by June 1.

We will work with Grace's Vacation Bible School students to pack the kits in early June. Grace Cantor Michael D. Costello will teach a two-session class on the inner workings of the pipe organ, focusing primarily on the construction of two instruments at Grace. Grace's larger instrument, used almost every time we worship, was dedicated in 1931 and again after major renovations and expansions in 1956 and 1986. The smaller instrument, used primarily as a continuo instrument for Bach Cantata Vespers liturgies, was built in Germany in 1969. To aid our discussion, class participants will be able to see (and play) the small educational pipe organ kit built for Grace in 2021.

Jesus' Ascension into heaven forty days after Easter is an integral part of the Easter story and an important festival on the church's calendar. Bach's 1725 cantata for the day is a festive one, opening with a chorale fantasia scored for choir, horns, oboes, strings, and continuo. The choir and orchestra will also perform a new work based on a sermon by John Donne from 1628 called A Future Waking, by Paul D. Weber, written in memory of beloved professor, pastor, and church musician Mark P. Bangert.
