This Cantata was first performed in Leipzig on Reformation Day, October 31, 1725. With the steady beat of timpani undergirding the horn obligato, the chorus proclaims the glorious "sun and shield" text from Psalm 84. The horns return in the third movement in the familiar chorale setting of Martin Rinkart's 17th century hymn "Now Thank We All Our God." Pastor L.
