Finance Report

Grace Lutheran Church General Fund – July 1, 2025 through December 30, 2025 (26 Sundays)

- Church Budgeted Contributions \$1,004,900 (\$38,650 per week)
- Church Actual Contributions \$954,000 (last year was \$911,000 through December 30)
- Church giving is \$50,900 (5.1%) behind budget, and \$43,000 (4.7%) ahead of last year.
- Today's December 30 deficit is \$133,000 (\$225,000 deficit last year through December 31).

This cantata for the Third Sunday after Epiphany was first performed on January 27, 1726. Drawing its themes from the biblical account of Jesus healing a leper, the cantata describes how the believer finds comfort in trusting that all things ultimately come to fulfillment in God's gracious will. The cantata concludes with the chorale Was mein Gott will, das g'scheh allzeit (What my God wills, that always occurs), a hymn of faith and contentment well known to Bach's Leipzig congregation. The prelude to the service at 3:45 p.m. will be performed by Grace's string quartet-in-residence, the Kontras Quartet.
